
A Devil of a time finding this secret

CHILAO ith water soaking through his white board shorts, sweat dripping down his blond eyelashes and his shirt completely drenched from swimming through deep pools, Tony Abel sat on a well-rounded gneiss rock, trying to catch his breath. His legs were fully extended and angled toward the water, and his arms flexed as he pushed himself down the slanted, slippery rock into a

10 foot long, four feet deep pool of clear, 70-degree water.

The scene was reminiscent of a backyard slide into a swimming pool on a hot summer day in the San Fernando Valley, but Abel, a resident of Canoga Park, was 27 miles from the nearest freeway, four miles from a single slab of concrete, 2,000 feet below the nearest road and in a section of the Angeles National Forest that sees fewer than 10 hikers on a summer weekend.
